





Music Notes

We welcome today's guest musicians:

Tracy Thorton has been performing, touring, and recording with various bands since he was 15 years old, performing many different styles of music and playing many different instruments. He was the founder, leader, musical director, manager and lead tenor pannist of the critically acclaimed calypso/jazz group "Been Caught Steelin'." He was also the founder of the nation's most exciting steel drum band "Sons of Steel."

Bradley Simmons is a Musical Director at Duke University in Durham, NC, where he teaches West African Music and History. His classes focus on djembe, songba, djun-djun and kenkeni. He also teaches Afro-Cuban percussion classes off campus. He is the leader of the percussion ensemble, Elements of Percussion that tours locally and nationally.

FPC is graced with Composer in Residence, James Biery

Today's anthem, Praise the Lord, by composer James Biery, was dedicated to "Kathy Cain Parkins and the Chancel Choir of First Presbyterian Church, Durham, NC". Mr. Biery will be worshipping with us on October 21.

On that day, the choir will sing another composition that was written especially for Kathy and the choir. All of the music that day will be arrangements and compositions by Biery. The hymn arrangements will include a brass quintet made possible by the gift of the Horst and Ruth Mary Meier Fund. We are the choir that he has chosen to give the first performance of "When in our Music God is Glorified," a piece that he has written during his sabbatical this fall. **The music on October. 14** will also feature an anthem by Biery. Please invite your friends. His biography follows:

James Biery (born 1956) is an American organist who is Minister of Music at Grosse Pointe Memorial Church in Grosse Pointe Farms, Michigan. He was Director of Music at the Cathedral of St. Paul in St. Paul, Minnesota, from 1996-2010. Biery was educated at Northwestern University, where he earned Bachelor and Master of Music degrees in Organ Performance. Mr. Biery also holds the Choirmaster and Fellowship Certificates of the AGO. In 2006, 2007, 2008 James Biery was awarded the ASCAP (American Society of Composer, Authors, and Publishers) plus an award for his compositions. Biery developed his compositional skills from two disciplines: years of study of the organ and its literature and intense scrutiny of the orchestral scores of numerous composers whose music he transcribed for organ duet and organ solo. As an organist, Biery has distinguished himself by performing much of the repertoire of the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. His facility at the organ combined with his demonstrated ability to perform and study a vast amount of literature has given Biery a firm basis upon which to compose for the instrument. He has recorded for AFKA and Naxos.
