Durham CAN Rally for the Hayti Community

On Monday April 24th Durham CAN is hosting a rally regarding the disposition of a 19 acre abandoned, vacant lot in Hayti known as Fayette Place. Campus Apartments which purchased the land from the Durham Housing Authority nearly ten years ago for the purpose of providing housing for North Carolina Central Students has left the property undeveloped and an eyesore to the community. The Durham Housing Authority has the right after ten years of neglect to reacquire the site. At the rally we will join with other member organizations of Durham CAN to support the residents of Hayti in their efforts to urge Campus Apartments to relinquish its claim on the property, to support the Durham Housing Authority in its intent to acquire the site, and to encourage the City Council to financially support this effort. The action on Monday night will be a crucial step in getting this abandoned, vacant lot developed into affordable housing. The rally will be held at Monument of Faith Church, 900 Simmons St. in Durham. The rally will begin at 7:00 p.m. and end promptly at 8:30 p.m. We need as many members of First Presbyterian Church as possible to attend this rally so that we can give maximum support to our neighbors in this Hayti community.
