Dear friends,

What an incredible day we had on Sunday! Beautiful music, an inspiring service, and a moving service of welcome for the confirmands! Thank you to all those who played a part in leading worship and all those who came to be a part of our worship of our Triune God together. It was truly a transforming day.

Over this past year, I have been fascinated by everything the confirmands have had a chance to learn together about the Bible, the Christian (and particularly Presbyterian) faith, other religions, and what it looks like to serve Christ in our lives as people of faith. I have often thought that I would love to do some of the things they are doing! I imagine many of us would!

The life of faith for those of us in this community (from the confirmands to the oldest in our midst) can often include ebbs and flows, highs and lows. A Parent's Day Service of Healing and Wholeness Saturday, May 13 at 5:00 p.m.


