Dear friends,

As we head into this week, we are filled with care and concern for many in our nation and around the world. We recognize the devastation caused by natural disasters all around us. We have been in prayer for our friends and neighbors and family members who live in these affected areas. Many have sent money to support Presbyterian Disaster Assistance and other agencies helping to rebuild these areas. We have sent a team to help clean up after Hurricane Matthew and no doubt will send other teams. Though we ourselves have not been directly hit by these storms, we recognize the pain and stress of our extended community. We also remember the devastated areas and peoples in Asia, Mexico, Myanmar, and Sierra Leone.

As we lift our prayers up for all those affected, we lean upon God's words of comfort and assurance through the Psalmist:

This Sunday, September 17, *Alec Bethune and Delia Kwon* will lead the class in some cartography (map making) of the Sea of Galilee, where Jesus called his first disciples. I wonder what it looked like? I wonder if you could see across it? I wonder if you could sail across it in one day? On September 24, *Li*-*Chen Chin* will start us off with music, and then *Marilyn Hedgpeth* will take us to the new Spirituality Center, where we can take off shoes, relax, color, build, create, and just rest in the Lord. Lectionary Class: The story of the escape of the Israelites from Egypt through the Red Sea is one of the most memorable and exciting in the Bible. What is its relevance for us today? Does God intervene miraculously in battles in our time? Join us for discussion at 9:45 in the East Parlor.

For September 24: What do we deserve? Are we "entitled" to the daily bread that we pray for? Do we deserve a greater reward than others because we have been faithful and obedient for many years?

Journeys and Scratch/Young Adults Class: This fall, Journeys and Scratch are combining classes in Room 205 to study the book, *The Road to Character*, by David Brooks. Brooks divides culture according to two paradigms: Adam I, whose members seek after economic success; and Adam II, whose members are more committed to character and the inner life. Then he follows with biographies of some who have aligned their lives more according to the Adam II paradigm: Dwight D. Eisenhower, George Marshall, St. Augustine, Samuel Johnson, Dorothy Day, and George Eliot, to name a few. The class will be team taught by members of both classes. All are welcome.

Spiritual Formation This year-round class for women is led by *Susan Dunlap* and explores the topic of spiritual formation. Join us at 9:45 in **basement classroom B-16**.

New Bible/Book Study: Cultivating Christian Character

It's not too late to join the Friday morning Bible/Book Study group. We will be studying the content of our character as Christians. Have we been created to compete successfully on the economic playing field, or have we been created to practice a life of self-restraint, self-erasure, and self-suspicion, as author David Brooks suggests in his book, *The Road to Character*? Or are we called to embrace the gifts of the Holy Spirit, as enumerated in Galatians 5: 22-23: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control? We'll start with these Christians virtues, and then during Lent, we'll veer over into the classic Christian vices (virtues gone wild!) to see where we stand. Part book study, part Bible study, the class will meet on Friday mornings from 10:30 – noon in Room 205 of the Education Building. On **September 15, we'll look at Galatians 5 as an introduction to the study**; and on Friday, September 22, we'll tackle the topic of love. All are welcome and invited to participate.
