I am so excited about events coming up during the rest of February (we are making sure the winter doldrums don't get you down!). We have a wonderful few weeks ahead of us as we move into the preparatory season of Lent.

First up is **Transfiguration Sunday** on February 11 (with Holy Communion, the children's choir, and more). Then we enter into the season of Lent with our **Ash Wednesday** services on February 14, at noon and 6 p.m. (see below for details). His theme for the weekend is "Martin, the Messiah, and #MeToo: Framing Faith-Inspired Activism."



LENTEN MATCH

Lent is a time to step back from our usual routines and engage in acts of transformation. The church traditionally suggests a threefold form of action for Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. As Jesus instructs his disciples, *Come and see what is happening. Come and follow me*. (John 1 35-50) We follow Jesus with a sense of wonder as to how things will turn out. Will our actions make a difference?

In this Lenten season of 2018, a generous donor has invited our congregation to join them in enabling transformative acts of service and mission. The donor will match gifts given by the congregation with their own gift up to \$20,000. The money will go to meeting emergency needs through our Walk-In ministry, feeding individuals who are elderly or disabled through Meals on Wheels, providing shelter through Urban Ministries of Durham, and to other organizations focused on meeting basic needs.

SUNDAY SCHOOL SCHEDULE

Children's and Youth Sunday School is a wonderful example of small group ministry in our church. On February 11, the class will talk about Jesus Healing a Young Boy in Matthew 9: 14-29. Then on February 18th, we will take a look at the Transfiguration of Jesus, as told in Mark 9: 14-29. Our prayers are with one of our teachers, **Li-Chen Chin, and with Sheya and Sean** also, over the death of her mother-in-law, and their grandmother recently in Philadelphia.

Faith and Community Class:

We have begun a month-long look at pastoral issues surrounding dementia / Alzheimer's disease, discussing how best to minister and care for those who suffer from these conditions, and their care-givers. After finishing the documentary, *I'll Be Me*, about singer/song-writer Glen Campbell, the class had a good discussion about what it might take to become a dementia-friendly congregation. This **Sunday, February 11**, we welcome **Dr. Warren Kinghorn**, Associate Research Professor of Psychiatry and Pastoral and Moral Theology at Duke Divinity School, who will lead a discussion of the theology of dementia. Then on **Sunday, February 18**, we hope to have a presenter join us to address issues of caring, both individually and as a community, for those with dementia and Alzheimer. This will round out our series on dementia and Alzheimer, which has been valuable in increasing awareness of an area in which FPC can grow in its inclusivity. The class meets at 9:45 in Watts-Hill Hall, and all are welcome.


