From the Pastor . . .

Dear friends,

I am excited to share with you information about the new Strategic Planning Team appointed by the session. As many of you will remember, the church went through an extensive time of study following Joe Harvard's retirement in May 2013. At that time, the session appointed a Mission Study Team who conducted an extensive survey and led many listening sessions and focus groups. The result was an extremely helpful document (click here for Mission Study report 2014) that guided the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) in their work as they looked for the next pastor.

One thing the PNC shared with me was the need to take the next step, to take the study and have a plan for the next 5-10 years. This new Strategic Planning Team (SPT) will be the ones to build on the mission study and take FPC to the next step of planning and implementation of the plan.

Because almost five years have passed since Joe's retirement and the start of the mission study, the congregation has changed somewhat – some people have moved away or are no longer able to be active, while others have joined FPC during that time. The city is changing around us at a rapid pace. While much remains the same, much also has changed.

The SPT, understanding the changes in our congregation and around us over the past 3-5 years, will be doing a bit of work in the next several months to build on what the extensive mission study already did. They will be putting together a few small targeted focus groups to help them glean information to build a new (much shorter) survey for the congregation, which will focus less on finding a new pastor and more on who we are and where we want to go in the future. The results of the survey will guide the SPT as they begin to host listening sessions and focus groups. Their hope is that this three-step process will allow for everyone's voice to be heard so that we can move forward into the future with a common vision.

The SPT will be working all year and looks forward to hearing your thoughts about the strengths and opportunities we have as a vital and vibrant, faithful and social-justice minded congregation in the heart of the city of Durham.

Stay tuned for regular reports in this newsletter from the team, whose names are listed below. Keep them in your prayers and pray that God will guide us all in the ways we should go as this congregation into the future God intends for us. How exciting it is to be a part of FPC in 2018 and beyond! Thanks be to God for our history, our present, and our yet-to-be-determined future.

LENTEN MATCH

Lent is a time to step back from our usual routines and engage in acts of transformation. The church traditionally suggests a threefold form of action for Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. As Jesus instructs his disciples, *Come and see what is happening. Come and follow me*. (John 1 35-50), we follow Jesus with a sense of wonder as to how things will turn out. Will our actions make a difference?

In this Lenten season of 2018, a generous donor has invited our congregation to join them in enabling transformative acts of service and mission. Refugee Resettlement

Several FPC members have been helping a refugee family from Afghanistan to resettle in Durham, after they spent 4.5 years in Turkey. The couple has three daughters, the youngest less than two-years old, and the other two already enrolled in Durham Public Schools.
