From the Associate Pastor . . .

Friends,

I shared briefly my journey with Cuthbert to Session Monday night (July 23) and thought you might enjoy how my travel to this North Sea island turned into a pilgrimage.

This was my 5th journey to Durham, England, for and with DukeEngage, the signature civic engagement program at Duke. I have toured the great Norman Cathedral each time with registered docents who with pride recount the familiar story of the founding of the city of Durham by Monks from the monastery of Lindisfarne in 695. The Vikings kept raiding the island and the Monks had enough and left with the incorrupt mortal remains of their Bishop, Cuthbert. After many years they found their way to the peninsula overlooking the river Wear where the cart that held the coffin got stuck in the mud and would move only when they followed a milkmaid and her lost cow towards "Dunholme." This was the sign they needed to finally place their beloved Cuthbert to rest.

But the fact is, of all my visits, I never was able to find my way to the holy island until this year July, 2018. The schedule for our program is tight but I found my way to the Northumberland coast to make my pilgrimage to that holy island on Monday, July 16, 2018. Finally my relationship to the spirit of Durham is now complete all be it in reverse from the holy Monks of that island in 686. I began my Cuthbert journey first at his shrine in the magnificent Cathedral and now after many years worked my way back to the church called St. Peter's where the Bishop was first buried after his return from his hermit life at the island of Inner Farne.

So my Durham story now is complete and I ask all DukeEngage Durham Students present and future, "why would you not go to Lindisfarne?" I recommended that this journey be part of their story of service in Durham.

SESSION BRIEFS

The FPC Session met for its July stated meeting on Monday the 23rd. At the meeting, the elders:

- Heard a report from the **FPC Legacy Society**, encouraging all to think about what we want First Presbyterian to become "generations out"; and
- Celebrated the news of the successful search for a **new Stated Supply Associate Pastor for Youth and Their Families, John Weicher**, approving a one-year renewable contract (a separate email will share the details on Wednesday, July 25).

In addition, the Session passed four motions:

- 1. **From the Personnel Committee**—Approved a request for proposals for a church staffing consultant;
- 2. From Finance and Investment Committee—Approved financial support for seminarian John Curran, an ministry inquirer from our congregation, who will begin at Chicago Presbytery next month;
- 3. **From the Service and Mission Committee**—Approved the endorsement of two applications to the Presbytery's Hunger for Change

Grant program, from the Durham Food Pantry and from the NCCU Presbyterian Campus Ministry;

4. **Approved the formation of an ad hoc committee** to consider solutions to the ongoing physical deterioration of the CE building.

In addition, the Session approved the use of the sanctuary by **Durham CAN's Souls to the Polls** on October 27, and heard reports from all the committees and the Strategic Planning Team.
