These carols, in the form of sheet music, were mailed to family and friends as Christmas cards, but were not published or recorded during his lifetime. "Some Children See Him" was the carol from 1951.

That you never give up on yourself when others turn away or do not understand


That you are attentive to the health of your body, mind and spirit




