Music Notes: The Prelude is adapted from a piece by French composer André Campra (1660 – 1744), who was well known for both sacred works and operas. His Rigaudon (a type of 17th –century dance), in a modern transcription for organ, is his most familiar work and is often played at weddings. The Offertory comes from an organ work by Canadian composer Denis Bédard. The quintet is playing three of the seven variations on "Amazing Grace" (No. 649 in our hymnal) from his original piece. We are grateful to the First Presbyterian Wind Quintet (Christyn Klinck, Joe Robinson, Li-Chen Chin, Brent Curtis, and David Smith) for their musical contribution to today's service.

The *flowers* are given to the glory of God and in memory of *Allen Verhey* by *Phyllis Verhey* and his children and grandchildren.





"Slavery by Another Name"



This 90-minute documentary is based on the 2009 Pulitzer Prize-winning book by Douglas Blackmon. *Slavery by Another Name* challenges one of our country's most cherished assumptions: the belief that slavery ended with Abraham Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation of 1863. It recounts how in the years following the Civil War, insidious new forms of forced labor emerged in the American South, keeping hundreds of thousands of African Americans in bondage, trapping them in a brutal system that would persist until the onset of World War II. Using archival photographs and dramatic re-enactments filmed on location in Alabama and Georgia, this film tells the forgotten stories of both victims and perpetrators of neoslavery and includes interviews with their descendants living today.
